Our Donors' Impact 2023

We are deeply grateful to our philanthropic partners for making health and wellness a priority. Thanks to their generous support, we are addressing the most serious health needs of our community and providing care for our patients...mind, body, and spirit.

In 2023, more than

2,300 donors invested \$10.7 million

in Virtua's programs and services.

Together through philanthropy, we were able to:

- Advance health equity by improving access to care and increasing health screenings.
- Grow our community outreach and deploy our mobile health platform to link under-resourced communities to care.
- Foster the development of South Jersey's health care workforce by supporting nursing education.
- Enhance a broad range of clinical programs, including oncology, women's and children's services, behavioral health, and more.

Virtua Health received three grants from the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA), including:

- \$2 million to modernize, expand, and enhance Virtua's Advanced Organ Transplant Center, made possible through a Congressional Appropriation.
- \$1 million to expand Virtua's Children Achieving Success through Therapeutic Life Experiences (CASTLE) program to a new location in Burlington County, made possible through a Congressional Appropriation.
- \$250,000 to enhance Virtua's Pediatric Mobile Services dental screening and oral health efforts benefiting children in under-resourced communities



Advancing Health Equity with Vital Screenings

In spring 2023, we launched the Mobile Health and Cancer Screening Unit, which is the newest member of our growing mobile health fleet. This 40-foot vehicle features leading-edge 3D mammography, an exam room, and a welcoming and patient-friendly registration area. Our team of clinicians and community health workers operate the unit and visit local businesses, places of worship, and community centers to provide access to potentially life-saving cancer screenings in Burlington County, Camden County, and portions of Gloucester County.

The impact that Virtua Health is having through our mobile community health programs has been fueled by our philanthropic partners. The remarkable capabilities of this new vehicle have inspired many generous donors to join us and be part of a project that will reduce health disparities in our region and save lives.

We are deeply grateful to lead philanthropic partner Aetna Better Health of New Jersey and other founding donors, including the Haines Family Foundation; the physicians of Virtua Health's Medical Staff South; Ott's Restaurants: Berlin, Washington Township, and Medford; the Virtua Memorial Auxiliary; and AmeriHealth. As of March 2024, more than \$1.7 million in philanthropic investments have supported the purchase of the vehicle, equipment, technology, and security system, and continued operations of the vehicle for its first four years.

From August through December 2023, the Mobile Health and Cancer Screening Unit team attended 37 screening events and screened 500 women, 79% of whom were uninsured, for various cancers. Through the New Jersey Cancer Education and Early Detection Program, in 2023 Virtua provided 1,322 free screenings for breast, cervical, colorectal, and prostate cancers.

Growing Our "Food as Medicine" Platform

Virtua's Eat Well food access program began in 2017 with the launch of the Eat Well Mobile Farmers Market. Today, we also have a mobile grocery store, a food farmacy program, seven colleague markets, and other service vehicles to support this busy enterprise.

Through philanthropy, Eat Well continued to grow in 2023. At the Eat Well Food Farmacy, 1,972 patients received nutrition education and free food, which is the highest number of patients we've served in a single year since the program began in 2018. Donor support also helped us provide countertop ovens to patients who might otherwise not have been able to cook food at home.

In 2023, thanks to a generous grant, we held 16 "tandem" events featuring our Eat Well mobile units as well as our Pediatric Mobile Services unit and Mobile Health and Cancer Screening Unit. These events provided convenient access to nutritious and affordable food, in addition to health screenings and education, and connections to other community resources.

To help improve food access in other parts of South Jersey, Virtua proudly partnered with the New Jersey Economic Development Authority to bring the Eat Well Mobile Grocery Store to communities in Atlantic City. We also expanded our annual Thanksgiving turkey and produce giveaway to serve families in Atlantic City this year in addition to those in Camden and Willingboro — all thanks to our philanthropic partners.

Caring for the Mind, Body, and Spirit

Doubling Services and Reach for Local Children

In 2023, the Joseph Lacroce Foundation pledged \$1 million in support of Virtua's Pediatric Mobile Services, making it possible to greatly expand this program. Thanks to their generosity, as well as the support of other philanthropic partners, we will be able to purchase a second vehicle that can help meet the overwhelming demand for services across Burlington, Camden, and Gloucester counties. With this new gift, the Joseph Lacroce Foundation has now committed a total of \$2 million to improve access to care for children who are 6 years old or younger.

The demand for this program has grown considerably over the years, and so has its reputation for excellent, compassionate care. We are deeply grateful to Sam, the Joseph Lacroce Foundation, and our many other philanthropic partners for helping us to achieve more than we ever thought possible and further dedicate ourselves to helping generations of South Jersey residents.
